are fun. There is more interaction with humans. Think about Volunteering! The shelter is a stressful place no matter what we do to change that fact. There is so much stimuli that can cause stress. Dogs barking, cats meowing, people walking in and out, cleaning routines going on, etc. Every dog and cat handles stress differently, but what they all have in common is the need for some type of normal family life, one-on-one attention. Enrichment games allow them to interact and use their minds. Just 10-15 minutes of mental stimulation will expend as much energy as a 30-minute walk. This can help them rest more comfortably. These activities help reduce the stress in their cages to help

reduce negative behaviors. Enrichment is essential in every pet's life and our volunteers and staff are embracing our new techniques to prepare these mind puzzles. It is not just fun, it is lifesaving! There is no better time to become a **volunteer** and there are things you can do from home to help. If you can't walk, you can work with our pets with enrichment activities. Pupsicles, snuffle mats, lick mats, pool of balls, treat puzzles and much more. In a few short months, we have noticed huge changes their ability to play and be dogs and cats.

Win the Flea War!!

Here we go, spring is here and with the warmer weather, fleas and ticks come out. Fleas carry diseases such as tapeworms and Lyme's disease. Although tapeworms are not actually



transmitted through flea bites, the fleas often carry tapeworm eggs. Lyme disease is present in Warren County and many dogs test positive for Lyme. Plan a year- round parasite program with your veterinarian for your pets. Protect your home, yard and treat infestations immediately. CAUTION ! Misapplication of flea and tick medications are the third highest cause of pet poisoning! Read all instructions and follow them exactly.







Grapes, Raisins and Dogs... Oh My!

An alumni of PAWS, recently ate some raisin cookies given by a family member which resulted in the loss of the pet. Did you Know about this toxic food for dogs? All grapes, raisins and currants, such as trail mix, granola, cereal, etc. can be deadly to your dog. There is a toxic agent in grapes and raisins that is harmful and even deadly.

What should you do if your dog eats grapes or raisins? Call the **Pet Poison Helpline (800-213-6680)** and seek medical attention from a licensed veterinarian immediately. Your pet may begin to vomit, show signs of lack of appetite, lethargy, possible diarrhea within 12-24 hours. The severe signs are acute kidney failure and a possible fatal outcome.

Other toxic foods for dogs are onions, garlic, alcohol, chocolate, cocoa, macadamia nuts, fattening food, and foods containing sugar, alcohol, sweetener, xylitol can be fatal.





Summer Safety Tips for Pets

- 1. Never leave a pet unattended in a car on a warm or sunny day.
- 2. Be sure to keep pets up-to-date on their vaccinations and other preventative medications.
- 3. Keep cats indoors.
- 4. Beware of cocoa mulch and other gardening products.
- 5. Plan your walks with your dog in early morning or later evening when it is cooler.
- 6. Keep pet rabbits indoors, they don't tolerate the heat.
- 7. Never tether a dog outdoors unattended. Obey the laws.
- 8. Keep pets properly restrained inside the vehicle when travel

Stray and Roaming CATS

Stray Cats will be out in numbers with the summer months approaching. Feeding stray cats can begin with noble intentions, but quickly the numbers increase. Because of irresponsible owners, there are too many cats left stray or to roam and reproduce and there are not enough homes and that is the sad reality. HOW LONG WILL YOU BE GONE?

Even ten minutes could be too long and reach 160 degrees for a pet left in a car on a hot day. That is hot enough to cause a dog to suffer heat stroke and permanent brain damage. If emergency care is not given, your pet could die.

Leaving the windows down won't cool the car enough. Of course your dog wants to go with you everywhere, but when the weather turns warm, better park your pet at home.

Road Rules Traveling with your Pet

- **Plan Ahead...** there are many pet friendly hotels and campgrounds; book ahead.
- Visit your vet...get a pet check-up and get written records of vaccinations to take with you.
- Update ID Tags...write your phone number in permanent marker on the collar and attach tags.
- Use a leash... don't risk your pet's life for one minute. Rest stops can be scary.



- Stop frequently... stop every two or three hours to stretch those four
- paws.
- Don't leave...

your dog in a hotel room...hire a dog sitter or take your dog with you.

• If you must fly...take a direct flight and check with the airline on their policies with pets.
